Why This Matters

The 10-Question AI Readiness Checklist

1 Do we have clearly defined business outcomes for AI?

Teams should articulate what AI will improve — efficiency, accuracy, speed, risk reduction, or customer satisfaction. If success can't be described in business terms, it's hard to measure.

2 Have we identified which workflows are best suited for AI?

Not every process benefits from automation. Successful organizations focus on specific, high-impact workflows rather than applying AI broadly. Know where AI fits and why.

3 Is leadership aligned on priorities and expectations?

AI initiatives touch multiple business areas. Without executive consensus on goals, risk tolerance, and investment expectations, projects lose momentum quickly.

4 Do we understand the quality and availability of our data?

AI depends on usable, accessible, and trustworthy data. Assess data ownership, consistency, and relevance to intended use cases. Many organizations underestimate this step.

5 Do we have governance in place for AI decisions?

Organizations need to know who approves use cases, monitors performance, and manages risk. Governance doesn't slow innovation — it enables responsible scaling.

6 Do we have the right mix of skills to support AI over time?

AI readiness requires collaboration across business, IT, security, and operations — not just data science. Assess skills for deploying, managing, and evolving AI beyond launch.

7 Is there a plan for how AI will be used in daily operations?

AI creates value only when it's adopted. Define how AI outputs will be used, by whom, and how workflows will change. Without this, AI often becomes "shelfware."

8 Can our infrastructure handle AI at scale?

Whether on-premises, cloud, or hybrid — your environment must support growth, performance, and reliability. Plan for future scale, not just current capability.

9 Do we know how success will be measured?

AI initiatives need clear metrics tied to business impact — quicker customer response times, reduced reporting hours, improved accuracy. Define what "working" looks like before deployment.

10 Do we have a roadmap beyond the first win?

Early success is important, but sustained value comes from sequencing initiatives over time. Organizations that plan beyond the first use case mature their AI capabilities faster.
